VII. REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT -

- 1. Updates:
 - A list of spring events was provided (attached).
 - Stephen Salisbury reported on the upcoming State FFA Convention to be held at Lyman on Saturday, May 30th. Students, parents, teachers, advisors, State/National representatives, alumni and political

dignitaries will attend the competitions, events and various other activities during the day. This is the first time Lyman has hosted the Convention.

2. Maintenance Report:

Jody Walsh updated the Board on the work that was completed over spring break, which included 194 items, 65 items remain open and 30 items will be part of the summer work. The lockers at the Middle School will be installed this week; the Building Inspector has deemed the press box "unsafe" and will put this in a letter; a total of 28 packets went out for lawn bids and a walk through has been conducted with 15 interested contractors; completion of yearly asbestos certification; review of custodial maintenance vacation schedules and coverage; principals have been asked to put in their request for summer work.

3. Professional Development:

Each principal updated the Board on the highlights of the March 30th Professional Development: Sandye Simon, LES – Sally May and Val Taft presented on O.T. and P.T. for staff and identifying gross and fine motor skills; Robin Cho presented on the 504 check; Lynette Braumhardt presented Excel and PowerPoint. Robert Laskarzewski, LMS – Reading/Writing Across Curriculum; Response to Intervention work; Science workshop – Discovery Science Program presented by Jamie Bender; Technology, web tools, with in-house staff. Stephen Salisbury, LMHS – Instruction for Varying Abilities; Response to Intervention.

4. School Readiness Council:

Sandye Simon reported on behalf of Dr. Hanna. The Council meets monthly and has been focusing on the spring kindergarten orientation process and changing the forum; The School Readiness Self-Study Team meets twice a month. A new parent questionnaire entitled *All About Me;* Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale (ECERS) visit, \$5,000 in additional funds to purchase materials for the other 2 classrooms and diversity materials; organization of program portfolio; application for School Readiness Grant due in May, additional grant funds available beyond the 5 years as long as the district meets eligibility; work with the pre-K and K staff on accreditation. There is an Action Item for the application of the grant.
