#### I. CALL TO ORDER

### II. PUBLIC COMMENT

Ronald Goldstein (resident and Audubon member) discussed the use of neonics in agriculture and impacts on humans and water quality. He noted that Senate Bill 190 is a proposal to control their use in Connecticut. The Commission decided to include an article on neonics in its 2024 newsletter.

The Commission asked that a 30-ton dumpster be placed at Public Works in April to give residents the ability to deposit road waste and that a sign be posted to that effect funds to come from "nip tax".
- c. Mr. Chester gave updates on farmland preservation (Flegert and Scanlon properties) and land preservation (Girl Scout Camp and Puhlick properties) efforts, and the Open Space Account budget.
