- I. Mr. Lang called the meeting to order at 4:32 p.m.
- II. Public Comment - None.
- III. Motion made by Alton Blodgett, seconded by Emery Gluck, to approve the May 10, 2010 meeting minutes. Motion unanimously approved.
- IV. New Business.
 - a. 6-21A: The Commission reviewed and rated an application requesting farmland preservation for 32+/- acres at North Street and Goshen Hill Road, Assessors Map 260, Lot 13. **MOTION made by Emery Gluck, seconded by Keith LaPorte, to recommend to the Board of Selectmen that farmland preservation appraisals be conducted for 6-21A. Motion unanimously approved.**
 - b. 6-21B: The Commission reviewed and rate an application requesting farmland preservation for 77+/- acres on Goshen Hill Road, Assessors Map 260, Lot 2. **MOTION made by Emery Gluck, seconded by Keith LaPorte, to recommend to the Board of Selectmen that farmland preservation appraisals be conducted for 6-21B. Motion unanimously approved.**
 - c. 6-21C: The Commission reviewed and rated an application requesting farmland preservation for 69+/- acres on Village Hill Road, Assessors Map 250, Lot 15. **MOTION made by Alton Blodgett, seconded by Emery Gluck, to recommend to the Board of Selectmen that farmland preservation appraisals be conducted for 6-21c. Motion unanimously approved.**
 - d. Tony Tyler, Diane Marquis, and Brenda Quesnel from Friends of Lake Williams were present to request additional town assistance in mitigating or eradicating invasives (fan wort and mil foil) and possible cyano bacteria (aka blue-green algae) at Lake Williams. They have engaged Northeast Aquatic Research to assist with the identification, sources of, and methods to eliminate these invasives. The Commission agreed to work with Friends of Lake Williams to engage CT-DEEP who owns a large portion of the lake to identify additional resources.
