

Lebanon Conservation and Agriculture Commission Regular Meeting Minutes August 9, 2021 Lebanon Town Hall

- I. Mr. Lang called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m., appointed Marc Wolf as a voting member, and noted that Dennis Goderre had resigned from the Commission.
- II. Public Comment None.
- III. Motion made by Alton Blodgett, seconded by Marc Wolf, to approve the June 7, 2021 meeting minutes. Motion unanimously approved.
- IV. New Business.
 - a. Discussion ensued regarding remediation work required by DEEP at the current Public Works site and the long-range planning for this site in accordance with the Plan of Conservation and Development.
 - b. MOTION made by Keith LaPorte, seconded by Alton Blodgett, to recommend that the Board of Selectmen bring to the next Town Meeting a resolution authorizing the expenditure of up to \$100,000 to be spent on open space soft costs, i.e., property appraisals, property surveys, legal costs, open space education, etc. MOTION unanimously approved.
 - c. Mr. Chester reported on the following items:
 - The town is conducting farmland preservation appraisals for 32+/- acres on the southwest corner of North Street at Goshen Hill Road (Assessors Map 260, Lot 13) and for 69+/- acres on the east side of Village Hill Road (Assessors Map 250, Lot 15).
 - USDA easement monitoring reports are due in September.
 - Senator Osten is assisting with setting up a meeting between DEEP, the town, and her office to discuss state assistance to mitigate or eradicate invasives on Lake Williams.
 - d. Mr. Lang brought up the need for conducting trail maintenance at the Commons Hill and Five-Mile-Rock Trails.
