Regular Meeting - Board of Trustees

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 by the chair, Cathe McCall.

Directors' report: Matt reported.

- Things are going really well and all programs are being held outside. They love their new space.
- Trivia is back weekly due to demand
- Book Club is being held outside as is Yoga which will probably continue until mid-November
- Friends met today and are moving ahead with the plans for the book sale. The book brigade will be held on September 15<sup>th</sup> at 6:00.
- CLA met today and discussed resource sharing
- Maggie met with all three schools to discuss ways to partner together
- Facilities  $-\frac{3}{4}$  of the building has working air conditioning. New shelves were installed and the company did a great job in about 4 hours. They were much faster than the movers.
- Other Personnel Cameron left after a full year but will sub as needed. Over 100 applicants applied for the position. Two were outstanding and with the blessing of the Board of Selectmen, they will both be hired for 10 to 15 hours each. Matt has requested that the Board of Selectmen hold a special meeting to deal with this.

- Volunteers have stepped forward to give valuable help
- Lebanon is in the red zone again and they are dealing with that. One patron came today and reported that his wife was home and very sick.
- New DVD policy instead of three days, they will be allowed out for a week.
- Circulation Good news from July. Circulation was over 5,000. Where normally it would be between 6,500 and 7,000, the number of 5,000 is way better than the 50% we had been at.
