Mr. Chester noted that the meeting was part of the Planning and Zoning Commission's planning process in preparing its 2020 Plan of Conservation and Development relative to open space and agriculture.

Bob Bernstein Executive Director of Northeast Farm Access provided an overview of his organization and how it has developed five (5) agricultural centers over the past six (6) years to both assist the development of small vegetable farmers and preserve farmland. Three (3) agricultural centers are located in upstate New York and one each in New Hampshire and Maine. Each center has an individual LLC with ag-friendly investors who own the property and homes which are leased to farmers. Each farm has managers who help oversee the center.

Northeast Farm Access has put together each of these project, including conducting the site master planning and the land development to include installation of infrastructure (deer fencing, drainage, barns/storage) and housing. Mr. Bernstein said that his organization would not be averse to creating an agricultural center in Connecticut.

Subcommittee members noted that the town has been successful preserving farmland and that the Commission was looking to establish new and small farmer initiatives, including the possibility of working to develop affordable small vegetable farms with affordable housing.

The meeting adjourned at 11:55 a.m.
